



Chapter III 3.1 Representativity

2009

Apprenticeships

Year 2007 Quantity of Attendants: 14

In November, ODEMA Headquarters held the first cycle of apprenticeships for Mutual Entities operative leaders from: Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, United States, Méjico, Perú, Dominican Republic, Uruguay and Argentina.

The apprenticeships were developed in the foregoing areas: Economic Aids, Social Service, Health, Pharmacy and Social Communication.

Results and conclusions:

All apprentices who visited the Subsidiaries agreed on the value of this experience.

The apprentices considered that their expectations were completely fulfilled and assured that this experience will contribute to the implementations and/or improvement of the services in its institutions.

Year 2008 October 14 to 16 Quantity of attendants: 3

Between October 14 and 16, members of the Sociedad Union de Carpinteros y Ebanistas de Concepción Chile, came to AMPF offices in Buenos Aires so as to participate of a Health training apprenticeship in the foregoing areas: Health, Dentistry and Pharmacy.

Conclusions:

The participants told that this apprenticeship complemented the training cycle they had started with a set of seminars in which they got the theory and, that now were applying practically upon the acquired knowledge.



Year 2009 November 25 to 27 Quantity of attendants: 6

During the three conferences of intense work, representatives of Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia and Mexico, participated in the activities of the different areas of AMPF.

The apprenticeships were performed in the foregoing areas: Social Service, Pharmacy, Economic Aids, Health, Social Communication.

Year 2010 October 27 to 29 Quantity of attendants: 4

Through the Training Institute "Carlos Castillo", ODEMA organized an apprenticeship programme in Social Benefit Societies in Medellín, Colombia.

The objective was the transference of knowledge and experiences in the development of the social service of Micro-Finances. Four apprentices participated: two from Argentina, one from México and an invited guest from El Salvador.

The apprenticeships were developed in nine Social Entities; each one with a different approach as regards performance of micro-finances, allowing an experience with Social Entities from Medellín city centre, as well as popular villages with very few inhabitants.

This own bulletin was created to spread the organization activities as well as our first report and it contained the objectives communication and planning under the motto: "Mutualismo sin fonteras".





3.3 Training

Training Institute "Carlos Castillo"

ODEMA houses the Mutual Training Institute "Carlos Castillo" which helps the development of the abilities of people related to modern social benefit activity as well as the continent itself, Social Solidary Economy, by performing shared-learning events, full-attendance, semi-attendance and distance courses, which are offered to own entities as well as related institutions that focuses on solidarity and associative principles in the resolution of human needs. This was acknowledged by ILO as a reference of social benefit activity teaching in the worldwide known centre of Turín, Italy.

Also, it has celebrated an important agreement with Centro Interamericano de Estudios de Seguridad Social (CIESS) that allows training as regards social benefit activity and social security.

Within the main activities, we perform tutorials, seminars, courses – such as our virtual 'apuntes para mejorar la gestión y el gerenciamiento", apprenticeships. Our target is managers and operative leaders of the Social Benefit Entities



Seminars usually have an exposition approach and provoke questions and discussions at the end of each conference; they do not necessarily include a periodic performance. The seminar is, basically, a training modality that privileges discussion upon collective reflection generating abstractions through the analytic-synthetic method upon which conceptual elaborations are built.

The courses: they are conducted by a teacher upon a topic of his specialty, as this is the classic teaching approach. The course offers a professional training modality more focused on the information than in the conceptual elaboration.

Seminars: This is an event consisting in a series of activities aiming at "give instructions or specific information in particular work sectors". It is applied to analyse problems and look for solutions, as well as stimulating the participants towards action. Its name suggests a one-day event, although it lasts more time.

Along these seven years, Odema has developed different spaces for training, academic and formative interchange.





The testimonies presented by the countries representatives on some services development have had






such a level that it has raised the interest of the rest in order to develop projects and/or alliances that enrich the respective social benefit societies.





3.4 Governability

In articles 12 and 13 of the Articles of Association:

Article 12°: All social benefit organization with democratic structure that fosters the social principles of defending and transmitting everything related to health and welfare of its members, on absolutely no profit basis and with a strong responsibility concept as well as a deep solidary practice can affiliate to ODEMA.

Article 13°: All members will have the following rights:

a) Voice and vow in the Assemblies.

b) Choose and be chosen by their authorities so as to represent ODEMA.

c) Be part of every matter as regards ODEMA programmes for the benefit of social organizations as well as their members.

Board of Directors Nature

Article 25°: ODEMA will be conducted by a Board of Directors integrated by two (2) members, one (1) Titular and one (1)

Designated Substitute, for each country belonging to the Organization . Each member will last in his post for four (4) years. The ones who will designated among them:

- One (1) President
- One (1) First Vice-president
- One (1) Second Vice-president
- One (1) Secretary
- One (1) Pro-secretary
- And the remaining ones will act as Vocals

En 2011 it was approved the confirmation of a commission that promotes and preserves the women's rights, in a similar action to the one of the commission UN Women, chaired by the Odema honourable counsel, Michelle Bachelet.

ODEMA will offer support to the social benefit societies of the American continent in its endeavours to assure the complete access to men and women rights in equal conditions in all social life environments.

The main objectives are:

• Promote and foster civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights that allow men and women participate in equal conditions in any society environment.

• Establish cooperation relations with international organizations, public and private entities and any other organization which actions tend to get equanimity between men and women





• Attend the director committee of ODEMA in topics related with the women rights and the equanimity of genre.

• Establish work strategies aligning ODEMA fundamentals, training and integration representation, and the main pillars of Women, the Inter-American Women Commission CIM and of any other organization with similar objectives.

Chapter 5 Global Compact Adhesion

In 2011, ODEMA considered of value to make known its support to the 10 principles on which the Global Pact is based upon, formalizing this act in October.

Commitment:

HUMANS RIGHTS

Principle 1

Companies must support and respect the protection of human rights acknowledged internationally. ODEMA's commitment is to support and respect the protection of human rights both, in the services offered in each joint society and the wider influence sphere, applying ethical demand as a guarantee of a civil behaviour and publicly acknowledging that respect to human rights contributes to improve a better management quality as regards the offered services, as well as the participation in all activities promoted by United Nations related to these matters.

Principle 2

Companies must assure not to be accomplices of human rights abuse of any kind. ODEMA's commitment is to assure that we are not directly or indirectly accomplices of human rights abuse of any kina both, in the services offered in each country and in the wider influence sphere We promote equanimity of genre by creating a Commission called ODEMA Women.

LABOUR NORMS

Principle 3

Companies must support freedom of union association and the effective acknowledgement of the right to collective negotiation.

Principle 4

Companies must support abolition of all kina of forced u obligatory labour.

Principle 5

Companies must support effective abolition of child work.

ODEMA acknowledges the importance of using dialogue and negotiation to achieve competitive results and assuming its commitment in the effective guarantee of them.

ENVIRONMENT

Principle 7

Companies must support a preventive approach before environmental challenges.

Principle 8

Companies must commit to foster initiatives promoting greater environmental responsibilities.

Principle 9

Companies must foster the development and spreading of technologies that respect environment. In ODEMA we keep the commitment of supporting a preventive approach in all our activities to avoid environmental damage by adopting beforehand actions that allow us fulfill such a commitment. We keep the commitment of developing initiatives promoting a greater responsibility and ethics in offering health, security and environmental services. And it has the commitment of fostering the development and diffusion of respectful technologies as regards environment, making the necessary changes in the processes and techniques of servicing.

ANTI-CORRUPTION

Principle 10

Companies must fight against corruption in all its ways, including extortion and bribery.

ODEMA's commitment is working in order to avoid bribery, extortion and other ways of corruption by means of the application of all high standards of management and administration, with a strict support to ethical and legal in-force norms in all our joint organizations in all countries.
